Elizabeth Sheehan and Bettie Carmack from the Attorney General's Office were present as legal counsel. The visitors present were Derrick Brown with Brown Beauty Barber School, Quoc Pham, Charlie Reece and Tammy Jones.

The invocation was given by Ms. Smith. Roll call was taken.

Ms. Smith made a motion to accept the minutes as presented from the July 27, 2015 meeting. Mr. Jackson seconded. All ayes, the motion carried. Ms. Smith stated that she was elected to the Secretary position with NIC at the recent national meeting.
